

THE MOST POPULAR MOSCOW SIGHTS ACCORDING TO INSTAGRAM USERS



Every year, Moscow is growing more popular with tourists. As the number of tourists increases, the number of photos of Moscow in social networks grows as well. In the end of 2017, Moscow ranked second among the most photographed cities in the world according to Instagram social network. Based on user opinions, the Committee for Tourism has prepared a list of the most popular Moscow sights.

Red Square

nce in Moscow, tourists usually go to see the Kremlin and Red Square first. Photos of the **Kremlin's Red Towers with Chimes**, St Basil's Cathedral, the Kremlin Wall published on Instagram is proper evidence that you are in the Russian capital now. These are the same landmark symbols as the Eiffel Tower, the Taj Mahal or Big Ben.

There is a Museum of History on the north side of Red Square, with St. Basil's Cathedral on the south. Previously, Upper Trading Rows occupied almost all the area opposite the Kremlin. Now it houses GUM, the State Department Store. Next to St. Basil's Cathedral you will find the first monument set up in Moscow — the monument to Minin and Pozharsky.

From Red Square you may **proceed to** Nikolskaya Street, which became world-famous during the 2019 FIFA World Cup. Fans from different countries gathered on this street to celebrate victories and **experience defeats** of their national teams. Now it offers improvised performances of street artists, and numerous cafes and restaurants.
